Mr. Gioello:

During the course of the public hearing process and continuing into the post hearing submittal process, AT&T has received the message from the city and the public that siting much needed new telecommunications facilities on existing utility poles is a preferred alternative. AT&T is committed to finding a lasting solution that allows us to serve the needs of our customers in the city of Eugene and to be a good neighbor.

To advance this goal, AT&T is withdrawing its conditional use permit application (CU 14-0003) without prejudice at the Crossfire Church site to begin a dialogue with city planning staff and Eugene Water and Electric Board staff to promptly reach agreement on siting the wireless facility needed for this proposed coverage area on an existing utility or light pole in the area.

AT&T believes that clarifying and refining existing policies and standards to allow greater use of existing infrastructure can create a win-win environment for neighbors in the area and the customers who are asking for improved and reliable service.
